The Durham Centre Committee has asked me to propose Mrs Christine Thomas, Durham Centre Member to be considered this year for the George Clark award.

Here follows a resume of the history of Mrs Thomas's activities with the Caravan Club and now the Caravan and MotorHome Club. Let's start at the beginning, the very beginning.

Christine was born 77 years ago and became part of the Family Membership with the then Caravan Club

when the area was known as The North East Group before it was split into two Centres Durham and

Northumberland in October 1959, her Father was the first Durham Centre Chairman. Christine has been all

these years an active member continually of both the Caravan Club and Durham Centre up to the present

time. She was actively involved with the running and organisation of both the Annual Easter Centre

Concerts and the Sedgefield float processions for a good many years until due to "Health & Safety" the float

processions became no longer practical. A video of one of the Easter Concerts was made and she sent it to

the television series You've Been Framed which was shown on television and the Centre received the

princely sum of £250. To this day it still occasionally appears on the show. Christine lives and breathes the

Caravan Club and attends most National Rallies as well as having represented the Club at International

Rallies abroad, she acted as CLO at the National for Durham Centre until the change in procedures. The

Caravan recognised her service and she was awarded The Caravan Club Loyalty Award for 50 Years

continuous membership, presented to her by the Chairman Mr Grenville Chamberlain.

Over the years she won items at National Rallies and she passed onto the Chairman an engraved Silver Rose

Bowl and embroidered cushion of the original Horse and Caravan for display in the Club Museum. Many

people will recall Christine actively towing outfits off the National and the Then Northern Centres when

ground conditions were very bad. Christine has served many years on the Durham Centre Committee, nine

years as Secretary, three as Chairman and during that period Durham were the Host Centre for the

Northern Centres Rally at Greystone where she was the Rally Chairman. She also has served as Rally

Secretary as well as covering various Committee duties. At the Durham Centre 50<sup>th</sup> Celebration Rally at

Beamish Museum in October 1959 she fulfilled the role of Rally Chairman, as well as overseeing the

organisation of our 40<sup>th</sup> Celebration Rally again at Beamish Museum ten years earlier.

She has run many Durham Centre Rallies and still does as well as having run rallies in both France and

Germany on behalf of the Centre. Her health has become an issue recently but she still attends rallies and

also runs rallies for Durham Centre and shows a willingness to continue giving her help and advice for the

foreseeable future. Such commitment and consideration to our Centre over many years, we feel is worthy

of recognition and are happy to support this application.
